SCHOLARLY INTERESTS

My interests reside at the interface of developmental psychology, cross-cultural psychology, and clinical psychology, with a particular focus on understanding the implications of 21st Century globalization (e.g., multiculturalism, media, migration) for cultural socialization and transmission, youth identity, parenting, and health. My central line of research explores modern forms of acculturation and enculturation, including ethnic/racial socialization, among youth and families from varying racial, cultural, and national backgrounds. My scholarship is transnational, transdisciplinary, and translational, spanning multiple countries including USA and Jamaica, multiple disciplines including psychology, media and nutrition sciences, and taking science from the lab to the living room by designing and culturally adapting preventive interventions. A major aim of my work is to identify and target risk and protective factors that decrease inequalities by promoting the resilience of children/adolescents in globalizing settings, while equipping parents to meet modern demands.
